
ROUND THE CHURCHES

98: Greenisland Methodist Church

In the early 1950s Greenisland was a sleepy dormitory village with no Methodist church. The Northern Ireland Housing Trust began building here, thus bringing an influx of people from Belfast – mainly young people with growing families.

The leaders of the Carrickfergus Methodist Church saw this as an opportunity for outreach and service to the community. Many staunch Methodist families lived in the area – the names Ardill, Cole, Jones, Hainon, Kerr, Logan. McDowell, Mercer, Miller and Montgomery prominent among them. Sunday evening services were started in the Unionist Hall, Station Road, and a Sunday School commenced in the home of Mr and Mrs Morton.

The Rev Frederic A
Tomlinson, a retired Methodist
minister from England, took
pastoral care and became greatly
loved by those with whom he
came in contact. Under his
leadership the new venture
flourished and it was decided
to search for a suitable site on
which to build a church and
halls for youth and community
work.

Initially the Housing Trust offered a site in the centre of the estate, but the committee wanted a site to serve the whole of Greenisland. Edwin Jones, a committee member, had occasion to talk to Sam Logan, who owned the garage at Whiteabbey. He told Sam that the Methodists were looking for a site for a new church in Greenisland. After a moment Sam Logan replied, 'I'll give you one. I have just

bought Corra Linn, a large house on Station Road. It has two acres and I only want half.' Edwin was astonished. Plans were drawn to build a church hall on the site. Sam Close, a bricklayer from Carrickfergus, Hugh Greer, a carpenter from Ballynure, John Buchanan, an electrician, and Sam McCune, a plumber, all gave their services free. The work was completed within 18 months without one penny being spent on wages. The opening and dedication of the Church Hall took place on 6 December 1958.
